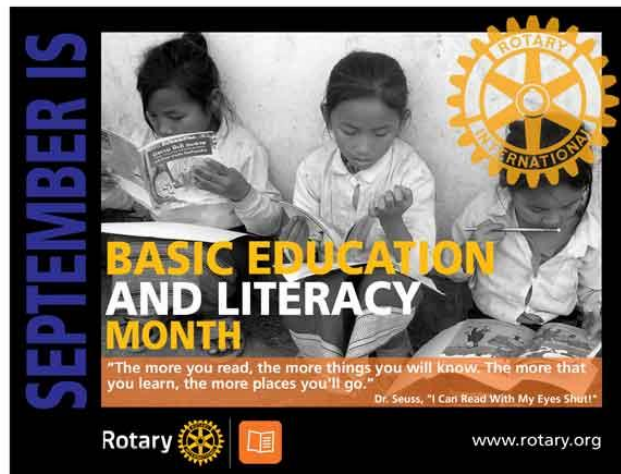

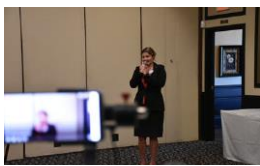

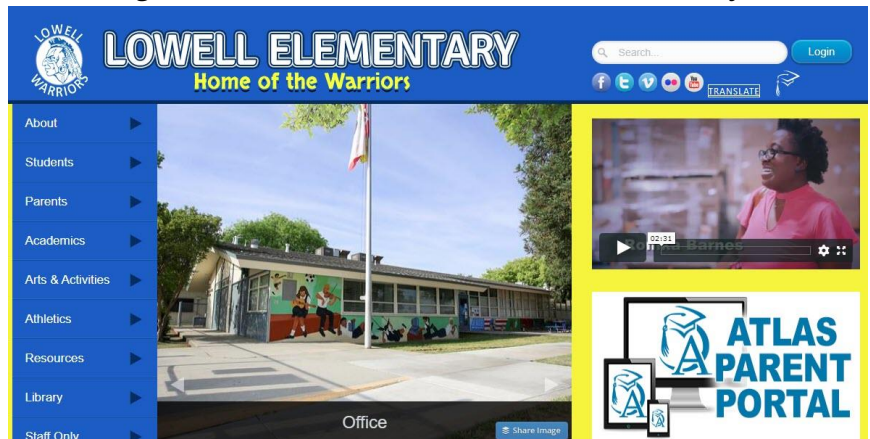

About this School

For one hundred and thirty years our Historical Lowell Neighborhood has lived and transformed as the City of Fresno grew around us. The Historical Lowell Neighborhood bounds itself by Divisadero Street (to the South), Belmont Avenue (to the North), Blackstone Avenue (to the East), and is pinched off to the west by the intersection of Highway 180 and Highway 99 creating a triangle to the north of Downtown. From its birth in 1884, the Historical Lowell Neighborhood has always been a mixture of diversity and it's this diversity that continues to keep the neighborhood a thriving community at the heart of Fresno.

By 1891, the growth of the neighborhood required the need of a school and land was purchased to fill this void. In 1895 Lowell Elementary School opened its doors to the community. The original structure stood at 167 Park Avenue but was demolished in 1966 because the structure was deemed too old to withstand an earthquake. Rebuilt on the same land, and with another addition in 1988, Lowell Elementary School is one of the oldest school sites that is still in use in Fresno ([Lowell Elementary Profile](#)).

The process of reinstating the men's wrestling program at Fresno State took a monumental step forward on May 10, 2016 as former Bulldog Director of Athletics Jim Bartko announced the hiring of Troy Steiner to become the head wrestling coach. Steiner, who spent 10 years at Oregon State from 2006-16, including the last four in the role of associate head coach, was tasked with restoring the wrestling program at Fresno State and recapturing the passionate wrestling community in California's Central Valley (goBulldogs.com).

new club in north Fresno, and appointed Past President Harry Michell to head a Committee to carry out the project. by May 19, 1948, Dr. Mitchell reported to then District Governor Kelly that 20 leading business and professional men located in the proposed territory and expressed a desire to become charter members of a new Rotary Club.

Fresno Rotary Club voted to relinquish area for the formation of the new club from Belmont Avenue north to the San Joaquin River. (This, a few years later was changed to from Divisadero north, and subsequently territory was relinquished by North Fresno Rotary for the formation of East Fresno Rotary in 1956, and Kerman Rotary in 1957, leaving the present territory for North Fresno Rotary from Divisadero north to the San Joaquin River, and from Blackstone west to Dickinson Avenue.)
